Thanks for coming to visit your student's school this evening! I've included a synopsis of important information on this handout for you.

Homework Load

- The curriculum, established by the College Board, is extremely dense.
Common assignments:
 - Nightly Reading:
 - Students read approximately 2-3 chapters weekly and are encouraged to take notes for open note quizzes.
 - Viewing Notes
 - These are short videos (approx. 7-30 minutes) designed to “flip” the content students know so that we can work on clarifying understanding and skill development during class sessions.
 - Document Analyses
 - Approximately 2-3 per unit.
 - Works by historians
 - Generally 1 per unit.
 - Research Projects (sparingly)
 - Span length of unit; group projects.

AP Exam

- The AP Exam for U.S. History is May 5, 2017.
- Three sections:
 - Multiple Choice
 - 55 “stimulus-based” questions, 55 minutes to complete
 - Short Answer Questions
 - Four questions of roughly long-paragraph length, 50 minutes to complete.
 - One *Document Based Question* (DBQ)
 - 55 minutes to write
 - One “Long Essay Question”
 - 35 minutes to write, 70 minutes total

Curriculum

- Course standards mandated by the College Board
- All courses submitted to the College Board for audit and approval
- Standard: represent first year university level course.

AP Exam Information

- May 5, 2017
- Exam Fee: approximately \$109.00
- Can earn college credit with a score of “3” or higher
- **AVOID HAVING STUDENTS TAKE THE MAY 6, 2017, SAT Exam!**

Test Preparation Guides--I strongly endorse their use!


Q: What are they?


Q: Why purchase the materials?
